Sneak Peek Article - Chapter 2



Last month I introduced the Speedster Project that Chris & I are working on this winter. This is a 30-day update! Our 1923 Chevrolet Speedster is beginning to look like a vehicle with a long ways to go! Those "daytime dreams" are still coming to us and some are making it into the physical presence of this Speedster Project!

Again stating the Speedster Chapter Motto:

All men dream but not equally. Those who dream by night in the dusty recesses of their minds, wake in the day to find that it is vanity. But the dreamers of the day are dangerous men for they act their dream with open eyes, to make it possible.

Our plan is to build this *DREAM* vehicle, a 1923 Chevrolet Speedster, primarily from the large accumulation of 4cylinder parts in my barn and Chris' garage! We did have to deviate from using the 30 x 3½" tires in the barn that were acquired from Pinky Randell several years ago. They were mounted on wheels that Pinky removed from one of his vehicles. While removing them from the rims, the tires began ripping apart rendering them useless, so new (safe) tires were purchased! It is believe those tires were form the 1960's; those 60 year old tires would not work on this project! This was my first experience mounting tires on "clincher" rims; a great deal of patience and muscle was required but I got it done!

Several years ago Chris purchased a 1922 Chevrolet chassis from a VCCA member in central Pennsylvania that I dug home for him. The chassis included a motor and transmission that were reportedly have very few miles on it. Over the winter I have disassembled the motor and found there was next to no wear on the babbitt crank & rod bearings and cylinder walls. During the cleaning of the motor components I did break two piston rings but was able to go to the barn and find pistons Chris had saved from the original "junk" motor from his 1923 Chevrolet Touring. Those pistons rings were standard bore and fit the 1922 pistons perfectly! That 1922 Chevrolet motor has now been assembled and ready for the 1923 Speedster *DREAM*! The 1922 transmission is next on my list to disassemble, inspect and prepare for the project.

Digging thru "stuff" in the barn allowed us to find a radiator, hood and a 1923 closed car cowl (as shown in the photos earlier in the article).

Now the fun part is to fit these on the 1924 Chevrolet frame that was removed from the stack of frames behind the barn. The 1923 frame we were going to use was totally disassembled and we found our hot riveting skills did not allow us to use that frame! The 1922 frame did not satisfy Chris' DREAM, therefore, it was not considered! The 1924 frame is the one on the bottom of the pile. Note that it was once used as a trailer with a hitch attached to the front steering mechanism. The 1924 frame was one we acquired from Pinky several years ago. We discovered that there were differences between the 1922, 1923 & 1924 frames that have caused difficulties in the assembly of this DREAM!





When "things" don't fit, modifications are required as the sparks show in this photo!

Our hope is have a 1922 Oldsmobile 3port on this Speedster motor sometime in the future. Need to see if we can find the missing parts for the head in the barn or Chris' garage!



The plan is to have this Speedster on the Road this summer to celebrate its 100th Birthday!

And yes, it Will it be a Rusty Relic!
